In recognition of their generosity, their gift will be recognized through the naming of the Cognitive Assessment & Neurology Treatment Room in the new Oakville Hospital.

The Cognitive Assessment and Neurology Treatment rooms will be new dedicated rooms that will be located in the Outpatient Rehab Department at the new Oakville Hospital. These rooms will provide the space needed to assess the impact of patients’ neurological limitations on their day to day functioning. Both these rooms are an asset to the hospital as well as to our community as the services currently available to meet the needs of patients with neurological impairments in the community is scarce.

The Cognitive Assessment Room will enable occupational therapists to conduct one-on-one cognitive assessments and retraining in an area away from visual and auditory distractions. The focus will be on functional assessments, education, retraining and connecting patients with the available community support and services. Patients typically need this service due to Stroke, early signs of dementia, MS, general aging, head injuries, and Parkinson’s.

The Neurology Treatment Room will provide a dedicated space for one-on-one assessment and rehabilitation of patients, by physiotherapists, with neurological impairments (e.g. Stroke, Parkinson’s disease). The room will ensure that patients receive the necessary privacy during their individual therapy sessions. The room will enable patients to improve their muscle strength, balance and functional mobility.

Bot Construction Group, based here in Oakville, has played an active role in the development of Canada’s infrastructure for more than half a century. A top corporate priority of the management of Bot Construction has always been giving back to the community. The Silvio Bot Charitable Foundation was established in 1996 for purpose of helping people to help others.

“A gift in support of the new Oakville Hospital further demonstrates the Bot family’s commitment to our community,” said Tina Triano, Oakville Hospital Foundation CEO. “As a result of this generous contribution, vital medical equipment will be placed in the hands of our talented physicians and nurses enabling them to provide quality healthcare.”
